IDENTIFICATION OF HIGH POTENTIAL LEARNERS IN THE CLASSROOM

Identifying high potential learners needs to be ongoing and to use a range of evidence. Identification must look beyond current attainment and consider a child's potential to excel if given the right support, challenge and opportunities. This is particularly important for disadvantaged learners, those with both high potential and SEND, and to ensure that the High Learning Potential Register reflects the intake of the school. This workshop will consider some of the typical characteristics as well as exploring classroom strategies which enable learners to demonstrate their potential (as well as being great learning tools).
